Conclusions and final recommendations

Conclusions

Pilot testing of the brochure on post-traumatic stress in the military environment provided a clear picture of the perceptions and reactions of active military, veterans and disabled servicemen and women to the design, content and usefulness of the material presented. The responses received were predominantly positive, indicating that the booklet successfully meets the educational and supportive objectives proposed.

Design

- Most active military, veterans and disabled military appreciated the design of the chapters as pleasant and attractive.
- The visual elements were effective in capturing and maintaining the interest of the readers.
- Some improvements were suggested, offering opportunities for small adjustments that could further enhance the visual experience.

Content

- The content of each chapter was positively evaluated, with most participants considering it excellent or good.
- The terms and expressions were deemed easy to understand, indicating that the language is clear and suitable for the target audience.
- The material was perceived as well-structured and easy to read, facilitating the understanding of the discussed topics.

Utility

- Participants unanimously considered the brochure useful for understanding posttraumatic stress disorder.
- The majority believed that reading the material would help both active and reserve military personnel, providing them with relevant and useful information for managing PTSD.

Recommendations

Maintain positive elements
